

Coordination Committee

- Represents interests of people or organizations
- Drafts an implementation plan for TCEQ approval
- Decides its own process
- Appoints work groups
- Communicates with public
- Meets February early Fall 2013



Work Groups

Perform roles assigned by coordination committee

- Technical work
- Recommendations
- Focused on specific issues or processes
- Other work assigned or undertaken

Include broad public involvement





Responsible for implementing Affected by implementation Provide information on issues and concerns


Knowledge of programs to integrate into plan

Possible categories

Governmental entities Citizens from each stream Homeowners Business and industry Parks interests Community organizations Environmental groups Universities, colleges, schools Coordination committee: How big, what interests on the committee?

- Discuss:
 - the ideal size of the committee
 - the interests that should be on the committee
- Share your recommendation with the entire group



Who might be on the coordination committee?

Break into small groups by interests, and develop list of possible committee members for that interest

Possible criteria

- Represents an identified interest
- Geographic diversity
- Cultural/ethnic diversity
- Willingness to commit time
- Good communicator:
 - with others on coordination committee
 - with identified interest group
- Open to ideas of others

Next Steps

 - Meeting rules
 - How to make decisions
 - Schedule
 - Workgroups
