Illegal Dumping

Chapter 365, Health and Safety Code

 Litter or other Solid Waste (Does Not Include Sewage)

• Class A, B and C Misdemeanors

• Strict Liability Offenses

Illegal Dumping

• State Jail Felony Offenses

Must prove a Culpable Mental State

Illegal Dumping

Commercial Purpose Dumping

 Class A Misdemeanors or State Jail Felony Offenses

 Want to file on Individual and/or Corporation/Business Entity

Water Pollution

- Chapter 7.145 and 7.147, Water Code
- Unauthorized/Unpermitted Discharges into or adjacent to any Water in the State
- Includes Storm Sewers and Sanitary Sewers
- Generally liquids that are discharged
- Have to take a sample!

Water Pollution

Special Misdemeanor – 7.147
Special Felony – 7.145

 The Misdemeanor is a Strict Liability Offense

Air Pollution

- Chapter 7.182, Water Code
- No Strict Liability Offenses
- Most common offenses charged are Nuisance violations and unlawful Outdoor Burning violations
- All Special Misdemeanor Offenses

Air Pollution

 Clean Air Act generally prohibits all outdoor burning within the State of Texas unless there is express authorization or the person comes within one of the exceptions in the rules.

Air Pollution

 Regardless of the 2017 Legislative changes, there still is no Class C Misdemeanor offense for unlawful Outdoor Burning!
