Class C Misdemeanors
 Can file as a lessor offense

Class B MisdemeanorsCounty charge

Class A Misdemeanors

 Commercial Purpose Violations
 File on Corporation or other
 Business Entity

County charge

Could file a Lessor charge

State Jail Felony Offenses
 Commercial Purpose Violations
 File on Corporation or other
 Business Entity

- County charge
- Could file a Lessor charge

All misdemeanors are strict liability offenses

- Civil Lawsuits are also strict liability No Culpable Mental State is required
- State Jail Felony Offenses Must prove a Culpable Mental State

Water Pollution

Chapter 7.145 and 7.147, Water Code

- Unauthorized/Unpermitted <u>Discharges</u> into or adjacent to any Water in the State
- Includes Storm Sewers and Sanitary Sewers
- Generally liquids that are discharged

Water Pollution

Storm Water Violations – Citations

If there is a discharge:

- File a Special Misdemeanor 7.147
- File a Special Felony 7.145

 The Misdemeanor is a Strict Liability Offense

Air Pollution

- Chapter 7.182, Water Code
- No Strict Liability Offenses

- Unlawful Outdoor Burning
- In a municipality Ordinance Violation
- If a Commercial operation Must file on the Corporation or other Business Entity

Air Pollution

Unlawful Outdoor Burning

 Outside of a Municipality – there is no State Law that creates a Class C Misdemeanor!

- Code of Criminal Procedure
- Chapter 4
- Article 4.14

Jurisdiction of Municipal Court

Art. 4.14, CCP

- A criminal case arising under the ordinances of a municipality
- Is punishable by a fine not to exceed
- (2)(A) \$2,000 in all cases arising under municipal ordinances that govern ... public health and sanitation, other than the dumping of refuse;

Art. 4.14, CCP

• (2)(B) \$4,000 in cases arising under municipal ordinances that govern the dumping of refuse;

Effective September 1, 2017

Criminal vs. Civil Enforcement

- Illegal Dumping
 - One-time Offense
 - Illegal Landfill
- Water Pollution
 - One-time Discharge
 - Ongoing, Daily discharges

Criminal vs. Civil Enforcement

• Can Criminal and Civil lawsuits be filed at the same time?

- An Injunction is not the same as filing a lawsuit for penalties.
- If both are filed, make sure there is an agreement before any charges are filed!
