Positives

1) Minimal educational work required

2)Minimal time or costs to start

Down side

Not as impactful as whole community systems for redirecting food wastes from landfills

Positive


Most diversion available

Down Sides

- 1)Educational effort is significantly higher than with yard trimming programs
- 2)More expensive, though typically provided as "free" in tandem with increased trash rates
