BRIEFING

The meeting started with a roll call to determine the members and/or alternatives present and a welcome from Loyd Smith.

PUBLIC COMMENTS

No public comments were presented to the subcommittee.

ACTION ITEMS

Item 3 – Election of Officers

Veronica Chapa-Gorczyński of the East End Management District was elected Chair of the TIP Subcommittee and Cory Taylor from Chambers County was elected the Vice Chair of the group.

INFORMATION ITEMS

Item 5 – 2021-2024 TIP-STIP and FY 2022 Unified Transportation Program (UTP) Update

Adam Beckom began with an overview of the purpose and work of the TIP Subcommittee for the benefit of the new members. Mr. Beckom then gave an update on the status of State approval for the 2021 -2024 TIP and the STIP. With ongoing developments, it is anticipated that the STIP revision cycle could commence in August 2021. Concerning the development of the 2022 UTP, H-GAC is watching to ensure that the UTP is consistent with the H-GAC Ten-Year Plan, the most recently approved TIP, and with the 2045 RTP.

Limited funding opportunities are available in the Federal Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act of 2021 (CRRSAA) funds allocated to the region. The funds must be obligated by September 2024 or they will lapse.

Item 6 – Call for Project Development Update

Vishu Lingala discussed the project evaluation criteria (planning factors) for major roadway and freight investments.

1. **Safety:** Evaluation will be based on the 5-year record of crashes at the project location and an estimate of crash reductions that will be provided by the project.
2. **Multimodal Accommodations and Improvements:** Evaluations for non-freeway projects will consider inclusion of multimodal accommodations and improvements that benefit pedestrians, bicyclists, and transit riders. These include ADA accessible sidewalks, bicycle lanes/shared use paths and access to transit. Freeway projects will be evaluated on accommodations and improvements that benefit transit such as managed lanes.
3. **Congestion Management:** Evaluations will be based on how a proposed project will alleviate congestion on the roadway, measured by improvement in travel time using the FIXIT 2.0 tool.
4. **Resiliency:** Evaluations will be based on criticality, vulnerability, and network redundancy scores derived from the H-GAC Regional Resiliency Tool. Compared against

investments within the same category, a proposed project that will bring improvements to roadways with higher vulnerability, criticality and network redundancy indices will be scored higher than others

5. **Connectivity to jobs:** Evaluation will be based on a project's urban or rural location and its resulting accessibility to jobs. In an urban setting, the proposed project will receive 5 points for accessibility to 1,000 jobs and 1 point for every additional 200 jobs, with a maximum of 10 points. In a rural setting, the project will receive 5 points for accessibility to 500 jobs and 1 point for every additional 100 jobs, with a maximum of 10 points.
6. **Transportation Equity:** Evaluation will be based on whether a proposed project improves access or connectivity to multimodal transportation in a disadvantaged community defined by the (average) score of that community on the H-GAC Livable Centers Need Index. At least one quarter of the project length must physically touch the disadvantaged community.
7. **Avoid/Eliminate At-Grade Crossings:** Evaluation will be based on whether a project avoids or eliminates an at-grade railroad crossing. The higher the vehicular traffic and/or daily train movements at the railroad crossing, the higher the project score.
8. **Functional Classification/Freight Network/Evacuation Route:** Scores will be based on the existing functional classification of the asset and whether the proposed project will qualify the roadway for a higher classification. Projects will also be scored on whether they are on a designated freight network or evacuation route, distinguished by the ADT on the roadway.
9. **Technology Improvements (ITS, CV/AV):** Evaluation will be based on whether a proposed project provides new technology or augments the technology on an existing or new roadway. This will be a binary assessment.
10. **Planning Coordination:** Projects recommended in prior regional, sub-regional, or local government approved plans or studies will score higher points. Project sponsors will be required to submit documentation of local planning coordination efforts. Furthermore, if a project intersects or would impact the operations of another asset that is controlled by a different agency, the project sponsor will be required to obtain a letter of support from the affected agency.
11. **Urban-Rural-Transitioning Areas:** Evaluation is based on project location and on potential travel demand on the roadway. Projects located in a rural area or in an area that is transitioning from rural to urban will be assessed based on the volume of traffic on the facility. Projects entirely within an urban area will score no points for this criterion.
12. **Environmental/Ecological:** Utilizing the Red Flag Analysis from the H-GAC Ecological tool, evaluation will be based on how many historical or archeological sites and/or how many acres of wetlands or floodways are within a ¼ mile buffer distance of the proposed project. The fewer the number of protected sites or acres of wetlands and floodways, the higher the project will score.

Set-Aside Programs: A new set-aside program was created for Safety. Other existing programs will remain in place. Work is on-going to define the contours of the Set-Aside programs.
