




# Monthly Change in Employment (000s) for Select NAICS Industries in Houston-Sugar Land-Baytown MSA May - June 2021






# Yearly Change in Employment for Select NAICS Industries in Houston-Sugar Land-Baytown MSA June 2020 - June 2021

■ Value of Single Family Unit Permits




