#### 12. CARRY OVER SPEND DOWN PROJECTS- ADDED PROJECTS FOR POSSIBLE ACTION

#### BACKGROUND

On December 15, 2023, the Transportation Policy Council (TPC) programmed (in the Transportation Improvement Program [TIP]) 60 projects represented by 25 sponsors with \$335,225,653 of federal funds. These projects were programmed to help spend down the region's carry over balances. One of the 60 projects (with a total project cost of \$500,000) was cancelled. All remaining carry over spend down projects will let or be transferred to Federal Transit Administration (FTA) by the end of August 2025. Local government sponsors agreed to participate in the Regional Strategic Transportation Fund (RSTF) program for 39 of the 60 carry over spend down projects. Draft Interlocal Agreements (ILAs) for the RSTF program were sent to local government sponsors for 13 of the 39 projects. Attachment 12-2 provides a status of the Draft ILAs. If all 39 projects are successful, the RSTF program will accrue approximately \$23M for which local government sponsors can compete in the future for certain projects.

#### CURRENT SITUATION

H-GAC identified several additional projects (see Item 12-3) that can let or be transferred to FTA by the end of August 2025 for TPC consideration to fund with the carry over spend down effort. There are 6 projects represented by 6 sponsors requesting an additional \$47,500,000 of carry over spend down funds. All 6 projects meet at least 2 Regional Transportation Plan (RTP) Visions and Goals (the same analysis and determination as conducted for the currently programmed carry over spend down projects). The projects would need 9,500,000 Transportation Development Credits to satisfy the local match requirement.

There is one project for consideration that would need an Advanced Funding Agreement (AFA) with TxDOT Houston District for the engineering/environmental ("E" phase). The other five projects would be transferred to Federal Transit Administration (FTA).

AUTHORIZING AMENDMENTS OF THE 2045 REGIONAL TRANSPORTATION PLAN (RTP) UPDATE AND THE 2025-2028 TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM (TIP) FOR THE HOUSTON-GALVESTON TRANSPORTATION PLANNING AREA

WHEREAS, the 2045 Regional Transportation Plan Update was adopted by the Transportation Policy Council on April 28, 2023; and

WHEREAS, the 2025-2028 Transportation Improvement Program for the Houston-Galveston Transportation Management Area was adopted by the Transportation Policy Council on June 28, 2024; and

WHEREAS, the proposed additions and revisions to the 2025-2028 Transportation Improvement Program are consistent with the 2045 Regional Transportation Plan Update and its finding of conformance with the State Implementation Plan for air quality; and

WHEREAS, the proposed revisions to the 2025-2028 Transportation Improvement Program are consistent with the federal fiscal constraint requirements established for the Transportation Improvement Program and are consistent with the financially constrained 2045 Regional Transportation Plan Update.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE TRANSPORTATION POLICY COUNCIL (TPC) FOR THE HOUSTON-GALVESTON TRANSPORTATION MANAGEMENT AREA THAT THE 2045 REGIONAL TRANSPORTATION PLAN UPDATE AND THE 2025–2028 TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM BE AMENDED TO REFLECT THE ADDITION AND REVISION OF PROJECTS IDENTIFIED IN THE TABLE OF FINAL RECOMMENDATION LIST OF CARRY OVER SPEND DOWN PROJECTS DATED AUGUST 23, 2024.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT FEDERAL FUNDS AUTHORIZED BY THE TPC FROM THE CONGESTION MITIGATION AND AIR QUALITY (CMAQ) AND SURFACE TRANSPORTATION BLOCK GRANT (STBG) PROGRAMS REPRESENT A LIMITING AMOUNT. ANY COST OVERRUNS ON PHASES OF WORK AUTHORIZED BY THE TPC OR COSTS INCURRED ON PHASES OF WORK NOT AUTHORIZED BY THE TPC SHALL BE THE RESPONSIBILITY OF THE PROJECT SPONSOR. IN NO CASE, SHALL FEDERAL PARTICIPATION UNDER THE CMAQ AND STBG PROGRAMS BE INCREASED WITHOUT CONSULTATION AND THE EXPRESS APPROVAL OF THE TPC.
