H-GAC Wants You to Breathe Easy this September *Take transit in September to improve air quality in our region!*

As we enter September, a month notorious for poor air quality, the <u>Houston-Galveston Area</u> <u>Council</u>'s (H-GAC) <u>Commute Solutions</u> program is launching a campaign challenging residents to take action to reduce ground-level ozone for September.

A collaborative of transit providers, including Harris County Transit, Fort Bend Transit, city of Conroe, and The Woodlands Township, are joining the effort with additional support from Air Alliance Houston, Houston ConnectSmart, and METRO Star. All invite you to "<u>Breathe Easy</u>" by shifting travel behavior in September.

To make the ride easier, join Harris County Transit, Fort Bend Transit, the city of Conroe, and The Woodlands Township for FREE FARE FRIDAYS, offering free fares for participating routes throughout September. In addition to taking the bus, there are additional ways to make a significant, positive impact on our region's air quality during your daily commute.

• Vanpool or Carpool: If the bus is not an option, try sharing a ride

• No Idling: Turn your car off when stationary to reduce emissions

• Improve Mileage: Ensure your tires are properly inflated

- Fuel Up Later: Fill your gas tank later in the day to minimize emissions
- Combine Trips: Plan your errands to reduce the number of trips you make
- Active Transportation: Walk or bike when possible or bring your lunch to reduce midday travel

H-GAC Projects Earn Recognition in State, Local Planning Awards Programs

Three <u>Houston-Galveston Area Council Livable Centers</u> studies were selected for recognition in the <u>Texas Chapter Houston Section of the American Planning Association</u> (<u>APA</u>) 2024 Planning Achievement Awards. One study was also recognized by the <u>Texas</u> <u>Chapter of the American Planning Association's 2024 Planning Achievement Awards</u>.

The <u>Prairie View Livable Centers Study</u> earned the Silver Planning Achievement Award for Public Outreach from the state and local chapters of the APA. This award honors an individual, project, or program that uses information and education about the value of planning to create greater awareness among citizens or specific segments of the public. The award celebrates how planning improves a community's quality of life. The Prairie View Livable Centers Study demonstrates that planning should be flexible to recognize the community's needs and adjust outreach to ensure residents understand the process and implementation.

The <u>Clute Livable Centers Study</u> earned the Silver Planning Achievement Award for Urban Design from the Houston Chapter of the APA. This award honors efforts to create a sense of place, whether a street, public space, neighborhood, or campus effort. The Clute Livable Centers Study represents how catalyst sites supported by the community can lead to positive change.

The <u>South Houston Livable Centers Study</u> earned the Silver Planning Achievement Award for Transportation from the Houston Chapter of APA. This award honors efforts to increase transportation choices for all populations to reduce dependence on private automobiles, help ease congestion, and reduce climate change impacts. Based on unique engagement opportunities in the community, the South Houston Livable Centers Study represents clear recommendations that will benefit residents.


