




### Monthly Change in Employment (000s) for Select NAICS Industries in Houston-Sugar Land-Baytown MSA Apr - May 2021






### Yearly Change in Employment for Select NAICS Industries in Houston-Sugar Land-Baytown MSA May 2020 - May 2021





### **Houston CMSA Single Family Permits**




