#### **AGENDA ITEMS**

#### HOUSTON AREA RAIL TRANSFORMATION (HART) GRANT WORKSHOP

Ms. Katherine Parker presented on the HART Grant Workshop. Ms. Parker gave a brief background on rail transportation and the purpose of HART. The Houston Area Rail Transformation (THE HART) is the Greater Houston region's collaborative and programmatic approach to leverage private and public funding opportunities for railroad projects in the region. The basis for this approach stems from the 2021 Houston-Beaumont Region Freight Study issued by the Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT), which provided the initial working lists of projects for consideration.

Gulf Coast Rail District (GCRD)/HART advisory committee began discussions in September of 2022 and formed the committee on January 17th via GCRD board action. Ms. Parker provided a timeline of events to show details of when discussions started and where HART is currently in the process. A flyer was also provided by Ms. Parker to inform the Committee of an upcoming workshop on June 11, 2024, at 10:00 a.m. The location of the event

# PROMOTING RESILIENT OPERATIONS FOR TRANFORMATION, EFFICIENT, AND COST-SAVING TRANSPORTATION (PROTECT) GRANT UPDATE

Ms. Caroline Bailey presented on the Promoting Resilient Operations for Transformative, Efficient, and Cost-Saving Transportation (PROTECT) discretionary grant program, funded through the Bipartisan Infrastructure Act (BIL), funds projects that improve the resiliency of the surface transportation system, including highways, public transportation, ports, and intercity passenger rail. The funds received by this grant would be used to create a Regional Transportation Resilience Improvement Plan, expanding on the Resiliency and Durability to Extreme Weather Pilot Program completed in 2021. H-GAC was awarded \$1.1 million in federal grant funding through the PROTECT discretionary grant program on April 11, 2024.

H-GAC Staff submitted a Planning Grant application for a Regional Transportation Resilience Improvement Plan through the PROTECT Discretionary Grant Program submitted on August 18<sup>th</sup>, 2023.

Staff completed work on the Resilience and Durability Pilot project as part of the FHWA program to develop transportation-specific resiliency best practices and strategies. The draft report has been finalized and accepted by FHWA. Staff has completed an update of the Foresight Panel on Environmental Effects report with outcomes from the Pilot project. #### TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM (TIP) DEVELOPMENT PROCESS

Mr. Adam Beckom gave an update on the Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) Development Process.

The Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) is a four-year capital improvements program for transportation projects. Under federal rules, all federally assisted projects must be included in the TIP to be eligible for funding. In addition, federal rules require that regionally significant local projects must also be included in the TIP.

H-GAC's TIP is included, along with all other MPO TIPs and rural TIPs developed by TxDOT, in the Statewide Transportation Improvement Program (STIP). The STIP, reviewed and approved by Federal Highway Administration and Federal Transit Administration, forms the basis for federal project actions including environmental approvals, permits and fund obligations. A new STIP is compiled every two years resulting in at least two years of projects carried over from the previous STIP each cycle.

H-GAC staff held two public meetings on April 3, 2024, for projects in the draft 2025-2028 Transportation Improvement Program. Additionally, the public comment period for the draft 2025-2028 TIP began on March 25, 2024. Over the last two weeks, H-GAC staff received request to extend the public comment period to allow the public additional time to weigh in on the projects set for implementation in the 2025-2028 timeframe. As such, H-GAC staff extended the public comment period an additional 30 days, which would close the comment period on May 24, 2024.

Through the TIP development process, the Texas Department of Transportation Houston District has requested over \$1 billion in Metropolitan Corridor (Cat. 2) and Congestion Mitigation and Air Quality Funds (Cat. 5) funds to be added to projects.

Mr. Beckom provided a table in the TAC 5/8/24 Meeting Packet to show the funding request by category and fiscal year. Chair Chapa-Gorczynski opened the floor for comments. 1<sup>st</sup> Vice Chair Morad Kabiri inquired if it would be fair to roll over 2015 projects that were not completed, into the new TIP. Mr. Beckom informed the Committee that a milestone policy has not been implemented by Staff to re-evaluate such projects, however Staff is upholding the Transportation Policy Council (TPC) commitment to keep the project moving forward, unless the Project Sponsor requests that the project needs to be removed. Mr. Beckom further mentioned that Staff worked with Project Sponsors to ensure those older projects were going into the correct fiscal year but will look at proposing a milestone policy.

Mr. Kabiri further mentioned that it may be reasonable to have Project Sponsors re-evaluate older projects that have not progressed in two to three years, Sponsors should recompete when the project is ready.

Ms. Sherry Weesner, concurred that a milestone policy should be considered and while some projects have delays, project that are not being worked on should recompete. Ms. Weesner further commented that when changing TIP from year to year, making amendments to the TIP, this could be an indicator or time frame for Project Sponsors to look at project readiness to ensure it aligns with the proposed amendments.

Mr. Joe Garcia, inquired about how the milestone policy can be addressed and be clarified. Mr. Craig Raborn informed the Committee that the policy will need to be addressed to the Transportation Policy Council and the topic may be considered as an item on the agenda for review and discussion.

Mr. Garcia recommended that the discussion of a milestone policy be brought back to TAC Members and a recommendation be made to the TPC for approval.

Mr. Bruce Mann further commented on an automatic trigger approach that if after two call for projects cycles have occurred, and no progress has been made on a project, this could serve as an automatic trigger to review those projects.
