

## Shaping the Future of Transit: Take Our Survey, Share Your Input on the US 90A Corridor Study

H-GAC and the Gulf Coast Rail District are collaborating on a study to explore transit options along the US 90A Highway corridor, which runs through key cities, such as Missouri City, Sugar Land, and Southwest Houston. This corridor is vital for commuters traveling to the Texas Medical Center, one of the region's largest job centers.

The study, launched in early 2024, aims to identify possible transit solutions to improve mobility, such as light rail or bus rapid transit. With input from a Steering Committee that includes local agencies and transportation groups, the study considers multiple routes and transit options to meet growing transportation needs.

Community feedback is essential for this effort. Residents can take a survey and share their mobility concerns through an interactive map. Your insights will help guide the development of a future transit system.


