ITEM 6. FEDERAL PERFORMANCE MEASURES AND TARGETS, KAREN OWENS, H-GAC

Ms. Karen Owens gave an overview of Federal Performance Measures and Targets to the Council. Ms. Owens mentioned this report was a culmination of months of data analysis and reporting progress towards the meeting the targets that were set in 2018. Over the last three months, staff has received review and input from numerous committees, TxDOT and local governments. These committees have recommended the targets and reporting that is being presented. A public comment period was held in July and she pointed out where responses could be located for future reference. H-GAC will report to the Federal Highway Administration with new methodology in February 2021. Staff is recommending 2022 targets be adjusted to reflect 2020 actual and expected conditions. She requested the Council approve Resolution No: 2020-32.

ITEM 7. REGION VISION ZERO POLICY, STEPHEN GAGE, HGAC

Mr. Stephan Gage gave an overview on the Regional Vision Zero Policy. Mr. Gage proceeded to tell the Council that the Vision Zero initiative is a traffic safety strategy that seeks to eliminate traffic fatalities and serious injuries. In 2019, the Texas Transportation Commission adopted the Road to Zero Initiative with a goal to eliminate all traffic fatalities by 2050. Mr. Gage described a graph and pointed out the federal projections versus actual fatalities in the 8 County Region. The item will be brought back to the Council for approval in October.

ITEM 9. AUTOMATED VEHICLE DEMONSTRATION PILOT PROJECT AT TEXAS SOUTHERN UNIVERSITY, THOMAS GRAY, H-GAC

Mr. Thomas Gray gave a brief overview on the automated vehicle pilot project. Committee Member, Dr. Carol Lewis, explained the demonstration pilot project. The partners involved were Texas Southern University, METRO and H-GAC. Dr. Lewis also mentioned that TSU provided administrative and research resources, METRO provided funding for vehicle acquisition and operations, and H-GAC provided funding support to conduct planning efforts, data collection and analysis. Dr. Lewis also described the various obstacles encountered during this study and the lessons learned. The pilot project operated June 5, 2019 to February 25, 2020.

ITEM 10. PRESENTATION OF THE 10-YEAR PLAN, VISHU LINGALA, H-GAC

Mr. Vishu Lingala briefed the Council on the efforts to update H-GAC's 10-Year Plan, its relationship to the TIP and RTP. The 10-Year Plan and is updated every year. All projects included in the Draft 10-year plan were previously approved by the TPC. The draft does not include Federal Transit Administration formula funds. Mr. Lingala proceeded to describe the various projects in the plan and included major projects such as NHHIP Segment 3, Grand Parkway, and Inner Katy BRT among others. Staff with continue coordination with TxDOT and other sponsors. The Council will be updated on the 10-Year plan in October and the Final 10-Year Plan will be brought back to the TPC for action in November. The 10-Year Plan will be submitted to TxDOT in December.

ITEM 11. BRIEFING ON FUTURE AMENDMENTS TO THE TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM AND REGIONAL TRANSPORTATION PROGRAM

Mr. Jim Dickinson presented a briefing on future TPC Amendments to the TIP and RTP. He described the following projects:

- Program the \$896K City of Conroe FY 2020 Federal Transit Administration Buses and Bus Facilities (Section 5339) award in FY 2021 of the 2021-2024 Transportation Improvement Program. The award will be matched with \$224K of local funding and used to purchase transit vehicles.
- Program two FY 2019 Federal Railroad Administration Consolidated Rail Infrastructure and Safety Improvements (CRISI) program awards in FY 2021 of the 2021-2024 Transportation Improvement Program. The \$700K City of Dayton Rail Crossings Improvement Project award will be matched with \$300K of local funds. It will provide for preliminary engineering, environmental analysis and documentation necessary to improve four at-grade crossings on Union Pacific Railroad track. The \$666K Greater Southeast Management District award will be matched with \$334K of local funds. It will provide alternatives analysis, preliminary engineering and federal environmental analysis, and documentation to grade-separate four current at-grade highway-rail crossings at the intersection of Griggs Road, Mykawa Road, and Long Drive with Union Pacific Railroad and Burlington Northern Santa Fe Railway in Houston.
- Program the City of Houston Antoine Drive 6-lane widening project in FY 2025 of the Ten-Year Plan (10Y). The 2018 Call-for-Projects \$79M federal Surface Transportation Block Grant (STBG) award will be matched with \$39M of local funds. The five-mile project includes turn lanes, pedestrian, bicyclist and intersection improvements and construction of a railroad grade separation.

ITEM 12. UPDATE TO THE FEDERAL FUNCTIONAL CLASSIFICATION SYSTEM (FFCS) ADAM BECKOM, H-GAC

Mr. Adam Beckom provided information on the proposed updates to the FFCS. TxDOT is requesting an update to three Waller county roadways:

Woods/Jordan Road

Update the federal functional classification of Woods/Jordan Road in Waller County from Local to Major Collector from IH 10 to US 90 (0.617 miles). Woods/Jordan Road is proposed to be widened

from 2 to 4-lanes with left turn treatments. This project (MPOID: 241) is programmed in fiscal year 2024 of the 2021-2024 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP).

Cardiff Road

Update the federal functional classification of Cardiff Road in Waller County from Local to Major Collector between US 90 and Morton Road (2.058 miles).

Morton Road

Update the federal functional classification of Morton Road in Waller County from Local to Major Collector between FM 2855 and FM 362 (4.175 miles).

These proposed functional classification updates are consistent with Waller County's major thoroughfare plan and the FHWA functional classification update requirements.
