

09D. Update on Safe Streets and Roads for All (SS4A)

BACKGROUND

The Safe Streets and Roads for All (SS4A) grant aims to improve roadway safety by reducing or eliminating roadway fatalities and serious injuries through Safety Action Plans that address all users, including pedestrian, bicyclists, public transportation users, motorists, personal conveyance and micromobility users, and commercial vehicle operators. Safety Action Plans will be publicly available documents that develop holistic, well-defined strategies to prevent roadway fatalities and serious injuries.

CURRENT SITUATION

The Safe Streets and Roads for All (SS4A) grant opportunity for federal fiscal year 2022 closed on 9/15/2022. The Houston-Galveston Area Council submitted an application for an Action Plan grant on behalf of the region to secure these important funds.
