Over 50 Years of Texas Trails 1968-Today

- 50 years of the Texas Driving Trails (initially the blue-lined driving circles on the map as part of TXDOT)
- Kicked off for the 1968 HemisFair in San Antonio
- Late 1970s the program diminished
- Late 1990s reestablished the Trails under the Texas Historical Commission and became regions with all 254 Texas counties part of at least 1 of the 10 trail regions

The Texas Independence Trail Region will be recognized as the definitive resource for partnership in tourism to tell the story of Texas Independence.


