### BRAZORIA COUNTY PY 2019 PROPOSED ACTION PLAN

### **Background**

Brazoria County Community Development & Welfare Department is requesting a review of the County's Program Year 2019 Proposed Action Plan for the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD). The purpose of Brazoria County's Annual Action Plan is to identify the objective and outcome for the PY2019 funds for HUD's Community Development Block Grants, HOME funds, and Emergency Services Grants.

# **Current Situation**

Brazoria County anticipates \$2,469,257 in HUD funding for PY2019:

- Community Development Block Grant- \$1,736,521 (with \$98,683 in prior year carry-over)
- HOME- \$478,237
- Emergency Solutions Grant- \$155,816

### THE 2045 REGIONAL TRANSPORTATION PLAN

### **Background**

The 2045 Regional Transportation Plan is the long-range plan that prioritizes surface transportation investments for the Houston-Galveston metropolitan planning area. Updated every four years, the long-range transportation plan outlines a fiscally constrained transportation investment program that is based on the unique needs and characteristics of the eight county Metropolitan Planning Organization region.

The plan and included projects support three strategies: manage our current systems and improve efficient operations; maintain, repair and rehabilitate our transportation facilities and assets; and, expand network capacity. The plan will guide approximately \$132 billion in transportation investments over the next 25 years. The plan included an extensive public outreach and comment effort.

### **Current Situation**
