

6. SAFETY ACTIVITY REPORT

BACKGROUND

The Transportation Safety Committee (TSC) is one of three Committees within the Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO). The purpose of the TSC is to advise the Transportation Policy Council (TPC) on the development of its safety programs, as well as promote traffic safety coordination with other planning activities. The Committee conducts the following activities, among others:

- Guide development and seek approval of the Regional Safety Plan.
- Guide development and promote implementation of safety action plans.
- Serve as the steering committee for all regional transportation safety campaigns and projects.
- Review traffic safety recommendations for all H-GAC studies and plans.
- Provide program direction for transportation safety grants administered by H-GAC.
- Review and make recommendations regarding current and/or proposed transportation safety legislation and regulations.
- Accentuate significant transportation safety issues to TPC and subcommittees.
- Make recommendations for corrective actions regarding regional safety issues.
- Identify opportunities and recommend actions for leveraging and coordinating regional resources from various disciplines to maximize safety efforts.

CURRENT SITUATION

The Chairman Robert Benz and the TSC has requested to give periodic activity reports to TAC and TPC. The purpose of these reports is to promote safety initiatives, request safety tasks and directives, review work of the TSC, and fill roster membership.

Currently, the TSC has nine vacant primary member slots and 19 vacant alternate members.
