H-GAC invites you to attend the second event in a three-part 2024 Livable Centers Roundtable and Workshop Series — Exploring Community Conscious Planning Practices.


The next event will be an in-person roundtable from 1 to 2:30 p. m., Thursday, June 20, at H-GAC, second-floor conference rooms.

Bringing Back Main Street Roundtable


