VALUES are focused on Fairness, Accountability, Customer Service, Teamwork, and Safety.



CARE It costs the city thousands of taxpayer dollars to clean up dump sites. This is more than just a visible issue on our streets, it's a budget issue, too. By reducing the number of hours our Solid Waste Management teams and law enforcement agencies spend working on this issue, we are reducing the cost to taxpayers. You are already on your way to helping by taking the time to read more about One Clean Houston.

LEARN Most people are aware of their trash and recycling schedule, but it can be overwhelming to learn where to dispose of every kind of material in the proper way. 
ACCOUNTABILITY Hold illegal dumpers accountable. First, collect information on the dumping activity: Approximate address of the site, date and time you witnessed the dumping or results of the dumping and photos of the activity.

Care

One Clean Houston allowed for funding to increase the hiring incentive to recruit more drivers as part of the Rapid Cleanup strategy. The incentive helps promote more applicants and is more closely aligned with other in the industry. The current signing incentive is \$5,000.

Junk and Tree Waste program collects large waste curbside for the resident's convenience, provided the debris is within 8 cubic yards or the size of a pick-up truck bed. Additionally, all six Neighborhood Depositories will accept both junk and tree waste 6 days a week.

- Junk Waste, also referred to as heavy trash and bulk waste, includes items such as furniture, appliances, and other bulky material.
 - Accepted during odd months only, for transport to a landfill.
 - Consider using the Reuse Warehouse for any extra building/construction material that could be used for non-profit entities.
- **Tree Waste** is defined as "clean" wood waste such as tree limbs, branches, and stumps. Lumber, furniture, and treated wood will NOT be accepted.
 - Junk Waste may NOT be placed for collection during a Tree Waste month.
 - All tree waste collections are taken to a Living Earth location for recycling.



Report Illegal Dumping

We need community buy-in to work together on a Cleaner Houston. In an effort to prevent illegal dumping, SWD has deployed 10 cameras in areas where illegal dumping is most frequent.


Additionally, the City wants to hold violators accountable:

- If you witness illegal dumping activity, please call Houston Police Dept. Environmental Investigations Unit by phone at (713) 525-2728.
- Collect specific information, such as site, date, time or license plates, but don't place yourself in danger by confronting violators.
- Also, Crime Stoppers Tip Hotline 713-222-8477 (TIPS).
 May be eligible for are \$5,000 reward.



Neighborhood Depositories

Houston has 6 Neighborhood Depositories with 4 Recycling Centers. Each resident can use them 4 times a month for Junk/Bulk, Tree Waste, and Recyclables.
