## **April is Fair Housing Awareness Month**

On March 21, during its regular meeting, the H-GAC Board of Directors passed a resolution recognizing April as Fair Housing Awareness Month for the Gulf Coast State Planning Region.

When it comes to housing, H-GAC reminds everyone that the <u>Federal Fair Housing Act (Title VIII of the Civil Rights Act of 1968)</u> and the <u>Texas Fair Housing Act</u> make it against the law to discriminate based on race, color, national origin, sex, disability, or family status.

The <u>Texas Workforce Commission Civil Rights Division</u> offers interactive presentations and trainings as well as a self-help library of trainings and resources to provide housing providers with a practical understanding of the U.S. and Texas Fair Housing acts, rules, and how to comply.
