5B. SUMMARY OF TRANSPORTATION PLANNING ACTIVITIES

Long Range Planning

1. Sub-regional Planning Initiatives (SPI)

- Chambers County Thoroughfare Plan study began July 1, 2023. A public meeting was held on Tuesday, October 22, 2024, from 5:30-7:00pm at White Park in Wallisville. The proposed Thoroughfare Plan, and street cross-sections were presented at the meeting for the public review and comment. There were 14 residents from Chambers County who attended the meeting.
- Washington Avenue Corridor study began October 1, 2023. The study team is developing alternatives to improve traffic flow along the corridor. Two steering committee meetings were held on October 9th and on October 30th. There is a focus group meeting planned for November.
- Old 6th Ward/TIRZ 13 Mobility study began November 1, 2023. The study team presented draft recommendations for the public to review and comment on October 1, 2024, at the First Ward Civic Club National Night Out, located at The Art Alley at Sawyer Yards, 1502 Sawyer Street, Houston 77007 from 6:30-8:30pm. The study team is working on the final draft report.
- FM 518 Corridor study began November 1, 2023. The study team has identified the needs along the corridor and is developing alternatives to address those issues. A Steering Committee meeting was held on October 23. An Old Town resident meeting is planned for November 20 and a public meeting is planned for early December.
- Pearland Mobility study began November 1, 2023. The study team has identified the needs in the City of Pearland and is developing alternatives to address those issues. The next public outreach event is planned for December 2024. The final Steering Committee meeting will be held in January 2025.
- Cemetery Road Corridor Study began March 1, 2024. The study team held a Pop-Up event on October 12, 2024, at the Aldersgate United Methodist Church's Fall Fest and is planning a focus group meeting for December 5th.
- Friendswood Parkway Corridor Study began September 1, 2024. The study team will hold the first Steering Committee meeting in December.
- 2. Freight Planning
 - The Greater Houston Freight Committee (GHFC) meeting is Tentatively scheduled for January 16, 2025. This meeting will be held virtually. Please contact Sydni Ligons at <u>Sydni.ligons@h-gac.com</u> to be added to the meeting invite.
 - Staff continue working to implement the policies and programs from the approved Regional Goods Movement Plan (RGMP). A workshop was held on September 30th September to reflect on the plan, make recommendations for future projects, and discuss the next steps and any possible outstanding project actions. Key taskaways and next steps will be presented in November to TAC and TPC members as well as the GHFC in January.
 - Staff continues to leverage public and private funding opportunities for regional railroad projects through the Houston Area Rail Transformation (HART). The next HART meeting is scheduled for November 15th at 1:30 pm.

- 3. Regional Incident Management, Safety, and Operations
 - In the month of September, Tow and Go successfully assisted 3,596 motorists by removing their stalled vehicles from busy freeways to a safe location. Safe locations are the next exit and are typically a gas station or parking lot.
 - Tow and Go partners including City of Houston, Harris County, and the Texas Department of Transportation worked together to on-board the SH288 Managed Lane as a part of the Tow and Go program.
 - H-GAC in partnership with TxDOT and Houston TranStar are in the planning stages to host a Transportation Incident Management Training in celebration of First Responders Safety Week. The free 4-hour training will be held on Tuesday, November 19 at Houston TranStar and will kick off at 8:00 am.
 - The Tow and Go Public Awareness Campaign is on-going with educational information streaming on radio, through digital and social media, and billboards across the region.
 - Hurricane Preparedness and Awareness Campaign for 2024 is on-going.
 - Staff attended the Houston Traffic Safety Coalition Meeting.
 - Safe Streets for All (SS4A) Safety Action Plan is undergoing procurement process. All evaluations have been completed. The Consultant has been selected and will go to the November Board of Directors meeting. The tentative contract start date is February 2025.
 - Safety Activity Report will be presented periodically at both TAC and TPC. Goals are to promote safety initiatives, request tasks for the Transportation Safety Committee, and fill Committee membership.
 - ITS Architecture and Website Update has completed all interviews to understand existing inventory. H-GAC will host an in-person ITS workshop on December 5, 2024, conducted by the Consultant. A virtual ITS workshop will be held on December 10, 2024, which will also be conducted by the Consultant. Goal is to frame H-GAC's role in ITS within the region and convey to local stakeholders how to use H-GAC's ITS Infrastructure to their benefit.
 - The Transportation Systems Management and Operations (TSMO) subcommittee meeting is scheduled for November 7, 2024. This meeting will be held virtually. Please contact Francis Rodriguez at <u>Francis.rodriguez@h-gac.com</u> to be added to the meeting invite.
- 4. Environmental Planning
 - Staff continues to follow local Environmental Justice news as they relate to the H-GAC Title VI Nondiscrimination Program.
 - H-GAC has completed the 2024 triennial update to the regional Title VI Program.
 - Staff is working towards updating the basemap of the Eco-Logical web-application and improving the tool's overall functionality.
- 5. <u>Resiliency Planning</u>
 - Staff attended an in-person FHWA MPO Peer Exchange Workshop on Resiliency in Atlanta, Georgia on October 24, 2024.

- Staff is working on finalizing the grant agreement.
- H-GAC's MPO was one of the 80 recipients that will receive funding from the PROTECT Discretionary Grant Program. The program awarded \$829.6 million in grant funding to fund projects to improve the resilience of the surface transportation system.
- H-GAC will receive \$1.1 million to develop a Regional Resilience Improvement Plan for the surface transportation system of an eight-county region that experiences repeated extreme weather events, natural disasters, and hazardous flooding conditions. The project will fine-tune previously developed strategies, identify gaps in planning, create a list of priority improvements that can be implemented in the short- and long term, and include a risk-based assessment of vulnerabilities to roadways, culverts, ditches, medians, and other transportation assets.
- Staff coordinated letters of support for regional partners PROTECT Grant Program applications.
- Staff completed work on the Resilience & Durability Pilot project as part of the FHWA program to develop transportation-specific resiliency best practices and strategies. The draft report has been finalized and accepted by FHWA. Staff has completed an update of the Foresight Panel on Environmental Effects report with outcomes from the Pilot project. 6. <u>Regional Transportation Plan (RTP)</u>

- The Regional Transportation Plan (RTP) subcommittee provides guidance and oversees the progress of the RTP. The committee must meet quorum, and meetings are held every second Wednesday of the month. The next meeting is October 9, 2024, at 1:30 PM.
- The 2045 RTP Update was approved by TPC in April 2023. The final report and 33 associated appendixes are available online: <u>https://engage.h-gac.com/2045rtpupdate.</u>
- The 2050 RTP development will commence in the new year with the first round of public outreach. The 2050 RTP is required to be completed by November 1, 2027, in accordance with federal law and guidance.
- Staff has finalized the RTP Project Development Process and online portal for project intake.
- The RTP Project Sponsor Workshop was held on May 15th, 2024. The workshop has 40 attendees (20 in-person and 20 virtual). The agenda included: overview of RTP Project Development Process, how to submit a project online, and presentations on publicly available, free to use data applications to enhance project submission.
- The RTP Project Development Process (PDP) closed the application portal on August 7. Internal evaluations have been completed, and fiscal constraint is now being implemented. This process will result in a new RTP project listing.
- Staff is meeting with all sponsors who submitted projects to the RTP PDP before presenting new project list.
- Staff anticipates the presentation of the new fiscally constrained RTP project list in December
- 7. Other Planning Activities
 - Staff continued to monitor regional travel impacts of COVID-19. Regional travel volumes were monitored through StreetLight data. Transit ridership numbers are now reported quarterly from transit agencies in the region; data for the third quarter of 2024 is currently being collected.

Permanent pedestrian/bicyclist counters provide updates on counts along regional pedestrian/bicyclist facilities. Staff have developed an online <u>COVID-19 Regional Traffic Impacts</u> <u>App</u> which displays vehicular, active, and transit transportation patterns during the Pandemic.

• Staff Completed the Language Access Plan and Title VI Program Update.

Short Range Planning

- 1. Project Programming
 - Staff coordinated the amendments to the 2023-2026 TIP document. Staff coordinated with TxDOT and local governments on the proposed amendments to the 2045 Regional Transportation Plan.
 - Staff met with local sponsors as part of the quarterly TIP monitoring efforts.
 - Staff completed evaluation criteria scores and is in the process of completing draft scoring and ranking of the projects submitted for consideration in five categories (Major Projects, High Growth Area Needs, Operational Improvements and Congestion Management, Resiliency, and State of Good Repair, and Transit).
 - Staff completed the project selection process for the Carryover Balance projects. These are projects that can be ready for implementation within the next 2 years. The effort included the selection of over \$335 M in surface transportation projects identified for project development activities and construction. Over the spring, staff will work to program these projects into the Statewide Transportation Improvement Program.
- 2. <u>Pedestrian and Bicyclist Planning</u>
 - Staff are continuing to work with the Data Analytics department to update the Regional Bike Network Map. Larger communities that have submitted their data are now live on the Regional Bike Network map. Staff have started the process of updating the Sidewalk data layer.
 - Staff held a kick-off meeting for the fourteen (14) month Buffalo Bayou East Design Concept study with the contractor SWA, and the project's sponsor, the Buffalo Bayou Partnership.
 - Staff held a kick-off meeting for the twelve (12) month Memorial Drive Bicycle and Pedestrian safety study with the contractor TEI Planning + Design, and the project's sponsor Energy Corridor.
 - H-GAC Board of Directors approved entering into a contract with The Goodman Corporation for the City of Friendswood Master Trails Plan. The twelve (12) month project is expected to begin December 2024.
 - The Bay Area Ped Bike study has been completed. Recommendations & the final report have been received and approved by H-GAC staff and the closeout process is finished.
 - Staff attended various meetings such as the City of Houston Bicycle Advisory Committees, Texas Pedestrian Coalition, Houston Safety Task Force, etc.
 - Staff continue to work with Procurement to enter a contract for counter installation work with the Texas Transportation Institute (TTI). After conferring w/Procurement Staff have split the work into 2 proposed contracts: one for permanent counter installations & one for mobile counter deployment assistance. Staff are working w/TTI to confirm if the budget for this expanded contract may necessitate Board of Directors' approval.

3. Transit Planning

- The regular quarterly meeting of the Regional Transit Coordination Subcommittee was held on Thursday, October 10, 2024. The Subcommittee's next meeting will be Thursday, January 9, 2025.
- The US 90A Corridor Transit Study began on March 12, 2024. Staff has launched a website for the study in partnership with the consultant and alternative alignments continue to be evaluated. The first Stakeholder Committee meeting was held on October 4, 2024.
- Staff is developing the Regional Bus Study, which will examine the feasibility of bus services connecting outlying communities to each other as well as the urban core. This AFA-funded study will be supplemented by an additional TxDOT grant to cover the entire 13-county H-GAC service area, which is recommended by the Regionally Coordinated Transportation Plan.
- Procurement has been completed for a consultant for the Transit Information Study, and the H-GAC staff is developing a contract with a projected start date of November 15.
- The Pearland Transit Study Final Report was approved by the City of Pearland's final staff in October. We anticipate the Final Report to be completed by November 6. The report and study are expected to be presented to the Pearland City Council, TAC, and TPC for December 2024.
- The Board of Directors approved two years of funding for the CMAQ Microtransit service in the City of Sugar Land. An interlocal contract has been executed. Sugar Land has received multiple bids for a turnkey project. Service is expected to begin in early 2025.
- The Dayton Transit Study contract ILA was executed with Dayton. The study will begin November 1, with the kickoff set for mid-November.
- Staff is working with METRO and regional transit partners to continue implementation of the Regional Transit Connectivity Project. Harris County Transit and Fort Bend Transit have gone live with Mobile Ticketing under the new partnership project. H-GAC and METRO are currently working to integrate all partners into the Regional Data Management System. A standing monthly meeting has been scheduled to discuss next steps for distributing operations support to the partner agencies, and METRO staff updated the Regional Transit Coordination Subcommittee at its October 10, 2024 meeting.
- Data collection for Transit Asset Management performance measures for FY 2024 is complete. Staff have contacted all agencies & have updated plans from all agencies. Staff began presenting the results to internal subcommittees in February. Staff presented to TAC & TPC for information in March. Staff presented to TAC for recommendation of FY 2026 targets & to TPC for approval of these targets in April. H-GAC staff are exploring options to reimagine the structure & data used in reporting these performance measures in the future. Staff met with NCTCOG in early July to discuss their process for collecting and analyzing this data. H-GAC staff plan to propose a working group or similar setup to the Regional Transit Coordination Subcommittee at the January meeting.
- The contract for research tasks by Texas Southern University (TSU) on phase II of METRO's autonomous vehicle pilot linking the campus of TSU & The Eastwood Transit has been executed. A kickoff meeting was held on Tuesday October 15th.

COMMUTE SOLUTIONS

- ConnectSmart's partnership with Harris County was launched during the employer's kickoff to open enrollment. The team collaborated with Commute Solutions to staff 10 engagement events throughout the county. Overall, there were more than 600 Harris County employees that were directly engaged during the month's events. The final tally of registrations is currently being finalized.
- Love to Ride and Commute Solutions launched the Biketober campaign throughout the region. This year's highlights are that there were 412 riders across 53 participating workplaces. Altogether, riders logged over 63,000 miles.
- Updates for the upcoming Regional Emergency Ride Home program were shared at the TAC and TPC meetings. It will go to the board in November with a launch anticipated for Spring 2025.

CLEAN VEHICLES PROGRAMS PLANNING ACTIVITIES

- Staff continue to work on a project to reassess the availability of Buy America compliant vehicles suitable for inclusion as part of the Clean Vehicles Program. Staff are continuing to work to reach out to manufacturers of vehicles and as well as electric vehicle charging equipment to discuss Buy America requirements and the availability of compliant equipment. Staff are also working with inhouse council to review federal Buy America rules and assess processes that agency programs can use to comply with these regulations. This work is ongoing and is anticipated to conclude no later than Q4 of 2024.
- Staff are continuing to limit the initiation of new vehicle replacement grants while efforts are underway to resolve ongoing Buy America issues. Once these issues are resolved, staff anticipate resuming awards for new applications.
- Staff are continuing to work with grant recipients who have recently received vehicle deliveries to support ongoing grant activities and process invoice materials for ongoing projects. These efforts are nearly complete and should wrap up within the next couple of months.
- Staff continue to monitor post-delivery projects that have not yet met the contractually required emission reductions based upon subrecipient performance. This monitoring effort ensures that

grant recipients' usage of vehicles remains within grant requirements and that vehicle use and mileage commitments are met. Staff are currently monitoring 132 project vehicles. Staff is developing an RFP to procure a GPS service provider to support these monitoring activities.

GENERAL AIR QUALITY PLANNING ACTIVITIES

- H-GAC continues to administer \$1 million in planning funds through the EPA Climate Pollution Reduction Grant (CPRG). Staff are working with project partners to develop materials to support the upcoming Comprehensive Climate Action Plan. This includes the announcement of an RFP to support public involvement efforts related to the upcoming climate action plan. In November, staff will inaugurate a new regular "Climate Corner" feature, as part of H-GAC's Regional Focus newsletter. This feature will provide monthly updates about our region's CPRG effort as well as multi-pollutant air quality efforts.
- H-GAC continued to work on regional efforts to support the Department of Energy sponsored Houston-Galveston Clean Cities Coalition. Under this program, staff worked with regional fleets to foster economic, environmental, and energy security by working to advance affordable, domestic transportation fuels, energy efficient mobility systems, and other fuel-saving technologies and practices.
- Staff have been working since late last year to develop a regional project for TCEQ's Rider 7 project. This funding is available to near nonattainment areas to provide funding for projects that could assist with the development of the State Implementation Plan (SIP). Our region is eligible for the PM_{2.5} portion of this program and has been awarded approximately \$450m in project funding. Staff is currently developing an RFP to solicit partners for this effort.
- Staff continues to administer and Environmental Protection Agency-funded Diesel Emissions Reduction Act (DERA) grant to deploy all-electric yard tractors at local freight warehouses. Staff have been working with IKEA to replace two existing diesel yard tractors at their Baytown facility with all-electric models. It is anticipated that this project will come to an end within the next several months.
- Staff is reviewing transportation conformity timelines for the next several years as well as how transportation conformity will interact with related timelines for a variety of other MPO activities and requirements.

TRAVEL DEMAND MODELING & FORECASTING

 Staff continues to provide travel demand and forecasting modeling supports to the Regional Transportation Plan (RTP), Transportation Improvement Programs (TIP), and other traffic and travel related data developments within the H-GAC MPO region that supports sub-regional and corridor studies for both TxDOT and other H-GAC member agencies projects. These include modeling support for TxDOT and non-TxDOT projects such as: Congestion Mitigation Analysis for SH 35 and the SH 99 frontage roads using projected traffic demand, the SH 99 (Grand Parkway Segment A) TxDOT project modeling alternatives for the new-build freeway in Grand Parkway Segment A, the FM 3345 Corridor Study (TxDOT) project in Missouri City, Texas, the northern Brazoria county/Pearland subregional mobility studies for the support of the subregional plan, TxDOT I-10E PEL Study, Waller County BPMS - FM 529, FM 1486 corridor study Montgomery County project, Benefit cost review for 5 categories consisting of: the major projects, high growth area needs projects, operational improvements and congestion management projects, resiliency and state of good repair project and transit projects requested by Transportation Department, and HCS2023 model run for SH35 vs SH99 frontage road CMA.

- Staff Tested ATOM 3 (V8) with 2045 model and compared results with ATOM 2, Conducting sensitivity analysis for ATOM 3 (V10), continues Updating existing model input files from the TAZ 5217 structure to the new TAZ 5808 structure, Reviewed benefit cost analysis for 84 projects for the Transportation Department, assisted in Setting up VisionEval production environment.
- Staff continues to work with TxDOT TP&P and the TTI for the forthcoming commercial vehicle and Galveston special generator survey in the H-GAC MPO region, continue to coordinate with H-GAC website team to develop a data and survey website for H-GAC completed and on-going surveys,
- Staff continues to coordinate with RSG Consultants under the ETC Institute Survey contract for development of the Airport sub-model, working with Cambridge Systematics and her team of sub-contractors for the Travel Demand Model Update and Maintenance tasks, continue to worth with the TTI on the development of the scope of work and survey instrument of the eight major Universities surveys outside the Texas Medical Center.

Safety Outreach Program

- Staff continues to work on Scope of work for Teen Driver Safety and will go to procurement for bidding process.
- Staff continues to work on Scope of work for Youth Traffic Safety and will go to procurement for bidding process.
- Staff attended meetings including Regional Transit Coordination Subcommittee Meeting, TIP Transportation Improvement Program HGAC Subcommittee Meeting, Transportation Advisory Committee Meeting, Pedestrian-Bicyclist Subcommittee Meeting and the Safety Committee Meeting.
