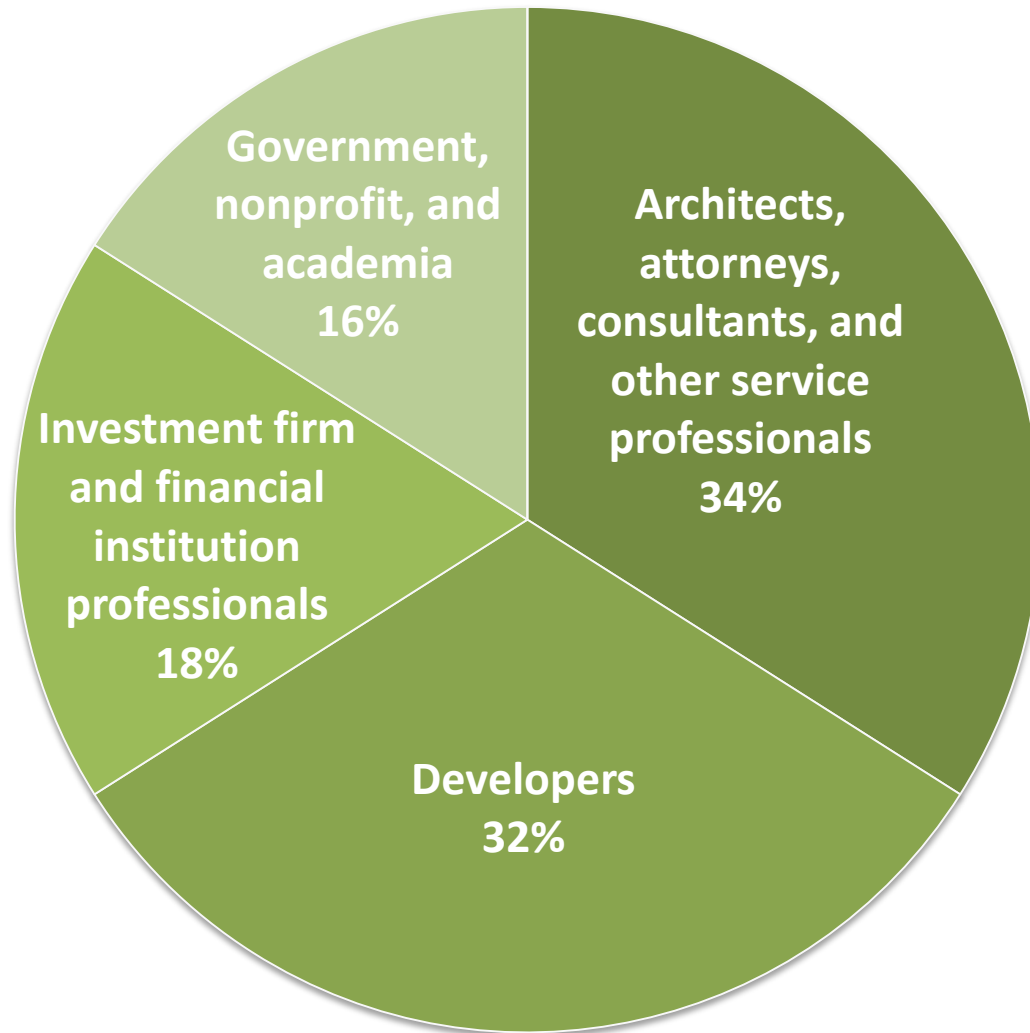

ULI creates impact through focusing on a stream of six program priorities:





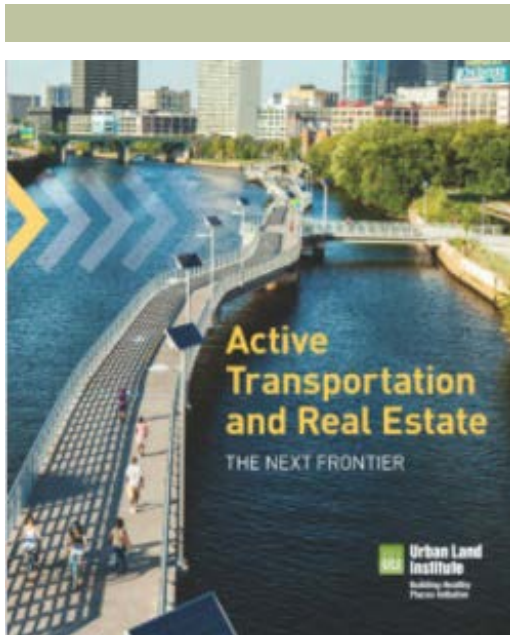
ULI convenes industry leaders from among its membership to advise communities on urban development challenges.

ULI Building Healthy Places Initiative: Leveraging ULI's global networks to shape projects and places in ways that improve the health of people and communities.

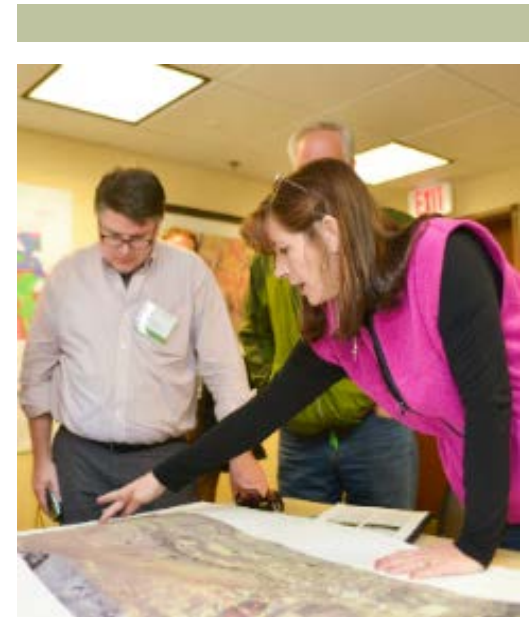
