Justin Bower has over 20 years of experience in leading natural resource management and urban planning efforts for a variety of local government and non-governmental organizations. For the past 14 years, Justin has served the Houston-Galveston Area Council in its focus on enhancing community resilience, most currently serving as H-GAC's Director of Community and Environmental Planning, overseeing the agency's natural resources, urban planning, disaster resilience, public safety, and conservation programs. Justin has an educational background in environmental science and urban planning, including a master's degree in urban planning and public policy from the University of Delaware.

Prior to RTCA, he taught grade school, managed internships, and interned at the National Park Service's National Center for Preservation Technology and Training.
